Families across Wales are being encouraged to take part in Sustrans' Bike to School Week 5-9 June and discover the benefits of cycling, scooting and walking.

Bike to School Week is an opportunity for children and parents to kick-start active travel habits and switch to cycling, scooting or walking for the school journey.

When it comes to the UK's five most popular used car makes, a high price tag is no guarantee of a clear history.

Of all the cars it checked last year, by Mycarcheck.com, BMWs were 21% more likely to have a warning against them than Fords, despite being, on average, around £10k more expensive.
