Jaguar I-Pace manufacturing in Austria has halted for a week, because it cannot get enough traction batteries from LG Chem's Poland plant.

It is the brand's fourth best seller, reaching 17,355 units last year and the Polish plant also makes packs for Ford Mustang Mach E and forthcoming Transit E.

Although nothing has been given to UK customers, Volkswagen Group is compensating some German diesel car buyers to the tune of €830 Million.

It covers engines which did not meet the required emissions standards over the last decade, but excludes disputed payments to lawyers representing a class action.

Beijing motor show has been postponed from April due to the concerns over coronavirus.

Held every other year since 1990, no revised date was given for this year's event.

The AlcoSense Elite 3 personal breathalyser has been launched.
