A Hyundai Nexo hydrogen car has cleaned up some of the Capital's dirtiest roads in a test in conjunction with University College London.

The car, which goes on UK sale next year, actually filters the air intake and removes harmful micro-elements and pushes out a cleaner exhaust than ingested air.

Poland has become a dumping ground for diesel cars which can no longer enter some European cities, says green-group Transport & Environment.

The country imported 350,000 cars from Germany alone last year among 850,000 it accepted and now the pressure group wants the business banned to save lives in Poland and clean up air.

GEM Motoring Assist says three quarters of its members back long-overdue changes to driver eyesight regulations.

A survey of more than 2,500 GEM members revealed 75 per cent support mandatory eye testing for anyone returning to driving following a court ban or medical revocation, with 71 percent also in favour of requiring a current eye test certificate to be provided at the time of renewing a photocard licence.
